Holiday Preparations

Now that summer has ended and we are enjoying the cooler temperatures of autumn, our thoughts start turning to the upcoming holidays. LWML has resources that can keep us in The Word during the busy holiday preparations.

There are some interesting resources on the LWML webpage. The devotional helps that I am sharing here are also highlighted in the Fall 2020 edition of the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly*.

Thanksgiving

The first idea is the "November Euchristeo Project: Reading and Writing Scripture – Giving Thanks to God". The instructions are to read a portion of Scripture each day, starting November 1. Next, select a verse (or verses) to write out on an index card, a note pad, or a journal. You may choose to string or clip the cards on a ribbon to make a "Thanksgiving Garland," include them in Thanksgiving cards, or use them as place cards at your table. Advent

If you use an Advent devotion or Scripture reading plan, consider adding a visual response element this year.



Instructions for using the devotional template

In the margins of your devotion book, or on a piece of paper, summarize the devotion or Scripture reading in one or two sentences. (For example, if you read Matthew 1:22–23 you may write: "God fulfilled His promise of a Savior as prophesied in Isaiah.")

Next, narrow it even further, using fewer words to summarize what it says to you. Write those words inside a space on the template. (Based on the sentence above I may say, "God keeps His promises!")

Any word pictures or images that come to mind can be incorporated with, or instead of, words.

As you reflect and respond to each reading, you can look back and review previous responses. What is God revealing on your Advent journey?

Approval of Rally Minutes

But everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way (1 Corinthians 14:40 NIV).

Have you sat at a zone rally and listened to the Zone Secretary's minutes being read, only to have forgotten half of what you are hearing? Perhaps you were thinking, "I don't think I can remember that long ago; I don't know that I should vote to approve the minutes." I certainly know that I have. After researching the reading of the annual rally minutes, I have the following suggestion to help us all:

Pre-approval of the minutes

You can pre-approve the Zone Secretary's minutes one week after the rally and then finalize the approval at the next rally. How can this be accomplished?

- Assign a committee to read the minutes within one week of the rally. Any corrections or additions would be made; the minutes would then be "preapproved".
- The Secretary would send the preapproved minutes to the Society Presidents one month before the next rally. This would give the Society Presidents time to have their members review them, if necessary.
- At the rally, give the voting body an opportunity to approve (or make corrections on) each page. (They will need some time to read through each page.)
- 4. The Zone President would then state that the minutes are approved.

I believe this method would be beneficial in keeping the integrity of the minutes. If you have any questions or would like to discuss this approach, please contact the Structure Chairman.

MISSION GRANT REPORT

A total amount of \$10,900 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$2,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination, \$3,600 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students, \$2,800 for Project 24 Christ's Care for Children - Kenya, and \$2,500 for LSF Haiti - Jacmel Lutheran Home and Center of Refuge Orphanage. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2020-2022 biennium.

YOUNG WOMEN

Two Young Woman Representatives (YWR) are being sought to attend the LWML 39th Biennial Convention June 24-27, 2021, in Lexington, Kentucky. YWRs must be a member of a Minnesota North District congregation and have not previously attended an LWML convention (on the national level) as a YWR.

The age preference is between 18 and 35 years old. A candidate will have a deep love and devotion for her Lord Jesus Christ and be willing to participate in the full scope of the convention, including all special YWR activities. Potential YWRs will need to be able to be away from home/work for the entire convention and the travel time involved.

The LWML Minnesota North District has made a financial commitment to send selected YWRs to the convention in Lexington. The two selected YWRs must commit to providing a convention report at the LWML Minnesota North District Convention in 2022.
