New mission grant goal is set!

A new mission grant goal of \$140,500 was set by the LWML Minnesota North District voters in June. The delegates selected the following mission grants to be funded for the 2020-22 biennium:

- 6. Financial Assistance for Food and Clothing Co-op CTS, Fort Wayne, IN \$10,000
- 7. At Just the Right Time Mission Central \$10,000
- 8. "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program \$5,000
- 9. Doxology Pastoral Care and Well-being \$15,000
- 10. Project 24 Christ's Care for Children Kenya \$10,800
- 11.LSF Haiti Jacmel Lutheran Home and Center of Refuge Orphanage \$10,000
- 12. Connecting People in an Inclusive Christian Housing Community \$2,700 (Partially funded)



MISSION GRANT REPORT

A total amount of \$16,600 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$3,000 for Orphan Grain Train, \$7,000 for C. R. O. S. S. Appeal, \$3,600 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students; \$3,000 for DOXOLOGY Pastoral Care and Well-being. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2020-2022 biennium.

You may remember when we crossed paths at Luther Island Camp in October 2018, my colleague John Kissinger and I shared with you about Project 24, the joint effort the MN-N district supports with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya to provide education and Christ-centered environments for orphaned and vulnerable children within the church. Last week, ELCK pastors were praying with families of orphans and vulnerable children of the P24 program during their third monthly distribution of food packages. And this time, community members who have seen the pastors with their repeated visits, welcomed them into their homes to pray, sing, and share the Gospel. Although church services have not yet resumed and large groups still prohibited, where able. P24 children with their caretakers have been able to meet in small groups with their site managers, pastors, deaconesses, and bishops for encouragement, hearing of God's word, counseling, singing, fellowship, and even reciting their memory work. Kissinger attended to visit a couple homes of the P24 children and was impressed to see the joy of the children, the caretakers, family, and community from the regular visits by the ELCK church leaders in their areas, and be welcomed into these communities in ways the church hadn't before. School resumes in early September, so more visits to come.

Have also been busy with construction for missionary housing, and mercy efforts have started in 11 other countries (now 20 churches in 15 countries) across Africa to allow church leaders to share the Gospel on radio broadcasts while helping many with needed resources. Even during hardship, the Word goes forth!

Many pastors in Kenya have let me know that they are praying for you, our church, and all Americans during this time. As Paul writes, *For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures, we might have hope* (Rom 15:4). It is humbling to be reminded from friends and partner Lutheran churches in Africa that it is in Christ that we have our hope.

As international travel restrictions remain in place in Kenya, it appears that our home service may be delayed until fall of 2021 (and we plan to go through MN-N at that time). In the meantime, we would be happy to connect with you for a virtual presentation at a district or zone event sometime.

Sorry for the long note. Please pass our greetings and thanks to the ladies of the MN-N LWML! We pray the Lord of all Creation will guard and preserve you. Thank you again for your support and prayers.
