## Mission Quilts: Much more than a blanket

Thousands of quilts are sent annually to all parts of the globe by Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Thanks to LWML quilters and other caring women, the needs of those who cannot provide for themselves are met.

LWR is one organization that ships the quilts to where they are needed. "There is, indeed, a transforming moment when a quilt passes from our hands into another's, and they embrace it," Kirk Betts, former chairman of the LWR Board of Directors said upon distributing LWR quilts in Niger.



When you make and send a quilt, you are comforting someone you have never met and providing an object that is useful in ways you probably never imagined. In addition to being a cozy, clean bed cover, it can be a:

- baby carrier tied around a

mother's back,

- market display spread on the ground and piled with vegetables,
- sack for transporting goods to and from market,
- sunshade,
- shawl, and most importantly,
- constant reminder that someone, far away, cares a lot.

LWR quilts should measure about 60" x 80." Full-size quilts best serve adult recipients and children as they grow.

### Help ship mission quilts

Shipping costs Lutheran World Relief about \$2.25 per quilt. Please give to the "Quilt & Kit Shipping Fund," which pays for the shipping of donated quilts and kits.
