"[Jesus] suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead." These are familiar words from the Apostles' Creed that encapsulate all that transpired during Holy Week, events foretold by the prophets.

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all" (Is. 53:6). Genesis 3:15 was fulfilled. Satan would be defeated by the One born of the Virgin Mary. The Lamb of God has taken away the sins of the world.

Without the cradle there would be no cross of Good Friday and empty tomb of Easter morning. We would still be dead in our sins. St. Paul asks, *"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:3-4).*

Freed from sin, death and the devil because of Christ's sacrifice and resurrection, we are free to *"walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace"* (Eph. 4:1-2).

Baptized into Christ and "In fervent gratitude for the Savior's dying love and His blood-bought gift of redemption we dedicate ourselves to Him ... we pledge Him our willing service wherever and whenever He has need of us" (LWML pledge).

The 26th Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Minnesota North District will be held June 23–25 at St. Cloud River's Edge Convention Center, St. Cloud, Minn.

The convention theme is "God Alone is Our Rock" based on Ps. 62:1-2, *"For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken."*
