"[The Lord] is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." 2 Peter 3:9

During this Lententide season, as you journey to the cross, the message of the Old Testament prophets and Jesus reminds you of your need "to repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."

Scripture tells you God is patient. You have a God who is long-suffering. A God who desires that you repent of your sinfulness. For God:

"desires that all people be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Tim. 2:4).

However God does not just desire you, but that everyone repent of their sins and trust in Christ for their salvation. Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for your sins, my sins and everyone's sins for all time. Christ has redeemed you, bought you back from sin, death and the power of the devil with His innocent, precious blood.

Luther's Small Catechism talks about repentance consisting of two parts: contrition and faith. Contrition is godly sorrow for your sin. Faith is trusting in God's promise of the forgiveness of your sins through faith in Christ.

Repentance that leads to faith and salvation is the issue for the Lord. Where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.


