October 31 marks the 499th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing 95 theses to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther desired

to engage in a debate about the practice of penance and the selling of indulgences by the Roman church of his



day. Luther's desire to debate and to listen to God's Word led to the reformation of the Church.

We are heirs of the Reformation and recipients of many treasures because of Luther's work. We can read God's word in our own language. We can receive both the body and blood of our Lord in His Supper. Our ordinary everyday callings (father, mother, worker, soldier) are honored as godly callings.

The greatest gift of the Reformation is the restoration of the Gospel — our righteousness before God is not based upon our works, but upon God's work in Christ. By Christ's death we are forgiven. That free gift makes for a very happy 499th Reformation.
