
Is your society growing? Does every member of your LWML feel that they are needed?

Mission Grants in Review

Grant # 5 - Salaries for Teaching Staff - Yambio Lutheran School, South Sudan

Yambio Lutheran School, located in South Sudan, continues to grow. More and more children are able to hear God's Word daily and grow in faith. Because of the financial situation, the six teachers who taught at this school had not received salaries. With this \$10,000 grant from LWML MN North, the six teachers have now received one year's worth of salaries for their work at the school.

Rob Lutz, a Lutheran teacher from Crookston, MN, has spent a number of summers at this school. Read Rob's note below about what happened when the \$10,000 arrived at Yambio Lutheran School this summer.

MITES IN ACTION UPDATE

The Rev. James Kollie Education Fund, Liberia received \$295 to support the attendance of Rev. James Kollie, of Cotton Tree, Liberia, to Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, IN. (Rev. Kollie is associated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia which was welcomed as a partner church body of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in May 2012.)

By attending the seminary, Rev. Kollie will be better equipped to serve his congregation and school at Cotton Tree plus help the foundation and growth of the Evangelical Church of Liberia. The present plan is that Rev. Kollie will be coming to the USA beginning with the winter term.

As indicated on our chart, this grant has been paid in full. Praise the Lord!

Mission Grants Committee Report

A total of \$12,400 was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grants Committee and Board of Directors paid grant allocations as follows; \$5,000 for Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students, \$3,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination, \$4,400 for Orphan Grain Train. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2014-2016 biennium.

NAME

The name of this organization shall be Name of Society of _____Lutheran Church, town, state. This organization shall be affiliated with the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (hereinafter referred to as LWML). Society Name is part of Name of Zone, of the Name of Region, of the LWML Minnesota North District. LWML is an integrated auxiliary of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.


FINANCES

The Treasurer's Report should be "filed for review"; if it says "filed for audit", it implies that a paid auditor is checking the books.

DUES

We recommend using "suggested donation" or "free will offering". This money is used for society expenses. This is an item that could be in the STANDING RULES, where expenses like payment for the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly, Zone dues, and National Convention Expense Fund assessments can be listed and easily changed.

DELEGATES

LWML Conventions on the national level meet in odd-numbered years. Unless a zone has sixteen or more societies, they are allowed to send one delegate to the national convention. (See the LWML bylaws that can be downloaded from the Resources tab at: www.lwml.org.)

Most of the expenses are paid by the District for the zone delegates; this is the purpose of the National Convention Expense Fund. An alternate is also to be named. The zone should have a "procedure in writing" as to how the delegate is selected.

District Conventions are held in the even-numbered years. Each congregation has the privilege of sending two voting delegates. (Two alternates should also be named.) It is recommended that society bylaws state how the delegates are selected and what expenses are covered by the society.

OFFICERS

You may have as many or as few officers as you wish. LWML and the District gather names and contact information of officers in order to keep them informed. This information is gathered each fall via the Fall Packet responses by societies and zones.

Yambio Lutheran Primary School in South Sudan

The Lutheran Primary School is located in Yambio, West Equatorial State (WES), South Sudan. It was started about 12 years ago. I, as an educator, am very interested in helping the Church in South Sudan grow. The primary school is seen

as a feeder program for future pastors, teachers, and deaconesses in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Sudan/South Sudan.

The school is very important to the growth of sound Christian doctrine in South Sudan. There are two pastors and two vicars on staff. There are orphans (lost children) who attend the school as well.

As the Lutheran Primary school develops more of the area children will begin attending. There are presently approximately 150 students and 6 trained teachers. The LWML MN North District has been an absolute Godsend to the primary school and the Church at Large! I truly appreciate the LWML MN North District being an important part of mission work in South Sudan.

To all the MN North District Churches:

I would like to mention that these five congregations (Grace, Becker; Our Savior's, Crookston; First English, Eldred; St. John's, Ottertail; and Immanuel, Grand Forks, ND) have funded most of my mission (and community) work in South Sudan. It has also been a privilege to work with the LHF (Lutheran Heritage Foundation). Working together we are all touching lives in Yambio. There is always room to have more people become part of this journey into missions! I enjoy sharing with others.
