

MISSION GRANTS REPORT

A total amount of \$25,000 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended, and the BOD approved, the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$4,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination, \$6,000 for C.R.O.S.S. Appeal, \$10,000 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students, \$5,000 for Financial Assistance for Food and Clothing Co-op, CTS, Fort Wayne. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2020-2022 biennium.

MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS WANTED!

Did you know that the first grant was given in 1943 for \$15,000 to Christ Church for the Deaf in Cleveland and the first grant the LWML Minnesota North District gave was in 1944 for \$5,000? Since then, millions of dollars have been received to fund Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) Mission Grants. Hundreds of these mission grants became realities because one LWML member or one LWML group learned of a mission need and made the effort to do something special — to submit a mission grant proposal to fund the project.

The deadline for submitting grant proposals for the Minnesota North District is February 15, 2022, for the 2022 – 2024 biennium. An individual or a LWML group can be a blessing to others by continuing to be aware of the needs in her community and submitting a mission grant proposal for them. The Human Care Committee is directed to encourage women in their service to the Lord, assist them in seeing the needs around them and provide resources to help them meet those needs. I read an article by Pastor Matthew C. Harrison, LCMS President, that said "every layperson ought to be busy in her many vocations, actively encouraging and sharing Christ, loving her family and those nearby at work and home." Since our Lord and Savior was born, lived a perfect life, died and rose again, we are free of our earthly fears to love and serve our all-powerful God.

Our committee is involved in our local monthly in-gatherings (like peanut butter and jelly go together) for the local group homes and care packages for our college bound students. At the zone level, we are involved in helping to choose destinations for in-gathering items and planning servant events. The Detroit Lakes Zone, at every rally, collects items for Orphan Grain Train and shoes for Lutheran Island Camp. The host group also finds a local organization to support that the women bring items for.

This fall, the Crookston Zone is doing a Servant Event as the opening activity at their Rally. We will make bead bracelets for MOST Ministries (Mission Opportunities Short Term). There are two in-gatherings. One is eye glasses that MOST distributes with the bracelets to tell the Jesus Story. The second is non-perishable items for the local food shelf.



Pictured is one of the projects our committee is passionate about. It shows some of the 103 boxes picked up in September and the 75 picked up the end of August. The boxes contain the various items for Orphan Grain Train that have been collected. They were sent off from Detroit Lakes. Sheri says it costs an average of \$12.00 per box to ship to it's destination so please remember Orphan Grain Train on your donation list.

Plastic sleeping mats are one of the items that Orphan Grain Train distributes. I got a chance to demonstrate the steps to make them at the LWML Retreat at Lutheran Island Camp in August. The goal was to encourage and teach

other LWML women how to get involved in this project. I received a huge boost of encouragement when the organizers of the Pastor's Wives Retreat volunteered to loop loops together to make the 'plarn' needed to crochet these mats.

God has abundantly blessed us. With the Holy Spirit's help we can share the material things that others 'see' our love for Jesus. God grant that we may see the needs beyond our families and see "our neighbor's need as our vocation to mercy", as Martin Luther so aptly put it.
