2006 CHRISTIAN LIFE ANNUAL REPORT MINNESOTA NORTH DISTRICT LWML

Following are the results of the society Christian Life reports.

One hundred thirty-two societies completed and returned a Christian Life report. These societies reported a total of 2,812 women actively involved in a Bible study group; many led the Bible study.

Seven zones from a possible 17 zones reported holding a Christian Life Workshop (Joy Shop, Share Shop, etc.) A total of 267 women in the District attended these workshops. Eighteen societies held a Mission Festival involving 1,153 people. Thirty-two societies used the 2006 Prayer Service with a total of 728 attending.

Of the sixteen zones that turned in a report, all held at least one rally during the year with a total attendance of 1,048.

We thank and praise God for all the wonderful women who are committed to the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. I personally would like to thank all those that took the time and made the effort to gather information and fill out the Christian Life report. Statistics can be boring, but they also make us aware of the hundreds of women 'serving our Lord with gladness' in the Minnesota North District LWML

kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. 13a: Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another." Four of my family members have had medical problems. Two are serious, with more treatment to come. All of them have required hospital stays with numerous tests. This can test one's patience and endurance when this all happens in a period of two weeks. Looking back at the past weeks, I wish to thank all of you for your prayers and support. It has been a time of acceptance for me that "All things will work out for good to those who love Him." (Romans 8:28) God will never let us down, He keeps on giving us strength for each day no matter what comes our way. God is our comforter, our refuge, and our strength.

- Is it a pastor's family that is struggling over major changes in their lives?
- Is it our congregations that are continuing to support one another, and are they growing in Christ?
- Are we keeping our military members and their families in our prayers, sending letters, packages and praying for them? Life is very lonely for the families when their loved ones are gone.
- Are we reaching out to those who are incarcerated and struggling to find their place in the world? These people are also God's special children. They and their families are ones we can reach out to with our prayers and support.

What lives will I touch? Everywhere you go, you are either letting the light of Christ shine through you or you are not reflecting His love. This is an awesome responsibility. It doesn't matter where you are: in the hospital, at home, in our church, our schools, or our community. God has put you in that spot for His purpose: to love and serve one another just as He loved you so much that He died for you.

### MISSION GRANT - \$7,000 ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN TRANSPORTATION

The Orphan Grain Train was organized in 1992. It is volunteer labor that makes it possible to give humanitarian help (both spiritual and physical) to people worldwide. The Grain Train has reached the needy in 15

regional sites in the United States and Eastern Europe, republic of the former Soviet Union, Africa, Mexico and Central and South America. Since tons of clothing, food and written material are gathered, it is most important to have the monetary means to get this aid to those in need. The cost of sending relief in a freight container is \$7,000. In John 14:18 the Lord tells us "I will not leave you as orphans, I will come to you." The Orphan Grain Train enables us to reach out to those in crisis with physical needs and most importantly with God's Word.

### MISSION GRANT - \$10,000 LUTHERAN ISLAND SUMMER STAFF TRAINING



Our congregations own the outdoor ministry site at Lutheran Island Camp, Henning, Minnesota. The staff at this

facility ministers to campers of all ages. These mites assist with materials and training of the LIC staff to emphasize the Christian life style as they work, play, grow, study, and witness to one another. Not only do the campers benefit but the staff workers as well. As they work in God's service, many are encouraged to follow the Lord's guidance in their vocational choice.

### **Keeping Things in Good Order**

This past quarter there have been no bylaws to review! That is really a first. We think though, that it doesn't really mean that all societies have their bylaws up-to-date! Remember that it is advised that you take a look at your society bylaws at least every 5 years. There may be only a few changes, or it may need an "extreme makeover." In either case, you will know that your group is doing things "decently and in order" as Paul advised in I Corinthians 14:40.

It is wise to take a look at your standing rules more often. These, as you know, are not part of the bylaws and are generally adopted individually as the need arises. They detail and explain how your group does things administratively. They can change annually or even more often, and they make things flow more easily and explain in writing how and when you do things.

One of the exciting things that will happen very soon is that the Minnesota North District Bylaws will be on our website and will be accessed from a link on the Structure Committee page.

The next thing might be to get the Zone bylaws on a link also! What exciting times these are and how awesome is our God to give us the abilities to do things electronically that were not even dreamed of a few years ago. We praise Him and thank Him. Also, remember that in just over a year the Minnesota North Convention will be in session. By October 2007 we need to bring to the Board of Directors any amendments that are proposed. If you have any suggestions, please send them to our committee.

Basically, this opportunity means that IRA holders who are 70 1/2 and older can now use IRAs to make gifts to LWML without paying the income tax. (However, the donor receives no income tax deduction.) this counts toward the donor's required minimum distribution.
