God Reigns in YOU!

From the beginning strains of the Pre-Service music during Opening Worship to the final notes of the Organ Postlude at Closing Worship, the time spent in Portland at the convention was filled with sounds of good tidings 'Your God Reigns!' (reference to Is. 52:7)

Familiar tunes and many new ones were introduced throughout our time in Portland as we 'Looked to the Hills'. For me, music comprises the basis for many of my memories of conventions.

During opening worship, I enjoyed the sounds of brass, handbells (evoking memories of my time as a handbell player on the hill of Concordia Irvine) and something new - the Neah Bay drummers. Listening to this group from the Nucha-nulth Nation, I was caught up in the essence of their praise - not just the beat on drums and chants, but through their dancers, they provided a visual example of **God Reigning** in their lives.

Yet it was not just the music that inspired me. There were many opportunities throughout the convention where we were encouraged and inspired to share, to fellowship, to mentor to each other. During Bible study, we 'climbed into' Naomi, Ruth and Deborah's hearts. We discovered how **God Reigned** in each of these women's lives and how they, in turn, mentored and guided others to have **God Reign** in their lives.

Listening to Heidi Floyd, a cancer survivor, we laughed and cried with her as she shared her trials with cancer - but climbed the hills of triumph, that through those trials - **God Reigned** - and blessed her with the birth of a healthy baby boy.

Even through the business meetings, God gave us glimpses (yes, even full looks) of how He reigns within the work of the LWML when we learned that we surpassed the 2007-2009 mite goal by <u>\$80,000+</u>! Missionaries and speakers encouraged us to 'Look to the Hills' - but not only in a figurative sense, but also in a REAL sense - by remembering, sharing and mentoring that **God Reigns** in US!

Even our Saturday night entertainment, the Pride of Portland, showed us a 'hill top' experience when they not only shared their singing talents, but also presented President Jan with money they had collected for the LWML for mites! **God Reigns**!

Our time in Portland finished with Closing Worship as we discovered how we can be 'Alive and Alove'. I leave you with these final thoughts and definitions about ALOVE:

1 - You worship Jesus even when life's a mess.

2 - You let nothing stand between your friends and Jesus.

3 - You are willing to widen your heart. 4 - It is the state of being loved by God. Friends, I encourage you to be ALOVE, to climb up the hills, even though it may be rough at times, to seek God. Instructions for Life

We receive and follow instructions every day. Sometimes in the mail we receive items that have, 'fragile', 'handle with care', 'open other end', 'do not bend', stamped on them. Other times we receive instructions with a new appliance, a new DVD player or clock radio.

Have you ever dropped a package marked 'fragile' just to see if it will break? Have you ever opened the end that says 'open other end'? Have you ever thrown away the instructions for something new without reading them to see if it works the same as the old one?

What about road signs, stop, yield, no left turn, one way only? Have you ever approached a road sign and wondered 'should I obey it???' We wouldn't even consider ignoring the instructions for driving on the highway. We follow instructions because we know what the consequences would be if we didn't. We follow instructions because it is for our own good. It will make our life easier, less frustrating, safer and less disappointing.

And so it should be with the instructions for living that God gives us through His Word. In Mark 12:30-31 he instructs us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.... Love your neighbor as yourself."

Throughout Luke 6 we read phrases like "...Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you, do not judge, do not condemn, forgive, give generously to those in need."

In Ephesians 5:1-2 we are told to "be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." And in verses 15-17, "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is."

The only way we can understand what God's will is for us, is to spend time in His book of instructions, the Bible. *"It is God who arms me with strength and makes my way perfect."* Ps 18:32

I encourage you to start your day, every day, with God's book of instructions. That time with God will enable you to face the day with courage, confidence, and peace.

Many of these staffers are using their LIC experience to solidify their decision to continue in God's service through professional church ministry.



SCHOLARSHIPS



God is calling

For some of us, the two scholarship mission projects are the ones we readily recognize. The man who ministers to our congregation prepared for this vocation through study at seminary. And we know all college students need financial support. As an LWML sister, may I offer additional thoughts regarding scholarships based on LSB#826--Hark, the Voice of Jesus Crying? (4)Let none hear you idly saying, "There is nothing I can do," (2)You can tell the love of Jesus, You can say He died for all. (3) With your prayers and with your bounties You can do what God commands: You can be like faithful Aaron, Holding up the prophet's hands.

I apply these words to each of us as we prayerfully use our Mite boxes-the hymn lines remind us to do so. Our scholarships become the full-time church worker support "holding up the prophet's hands." Ladies, you have been marvelous encouragers to tell the college-bound people within your congregations that LWML can help. Some of the applicants for the upcoming school year stated that ladies within their congregation told them to check out the LWML scholarship opportunity. Some of these ladies were mothers and grandmothers. Some of these encouragers were Pastors (whose wives are LWMLers!) and some mentioned LWML website information, but several just said "a few ladies in my congregation kept asking me if I had sent in my scholarship application."

The applicants always include comments that they appreciate and welcome our encouragement whenever they worship within their home congregations. Again: the hymn--(4)"Take the task He gives you gladly, Let His work your pleasure be:"

There were 18 applicants which includes 5 new names to replace the 5 college seniors that graduated in the spring. There is only 1 seminarian who requested LWML assistance. He had applied last year. The other 5 men from last year continue their Walk in the Light: three are now on vicarage, one was ordained and one is now studying outside the United States. Some of the men whom we support in the mission project for full-time-church workers are listing pre-seminary as their course of study. We need to keep praying that others will choose to apply to our seminaries and that other students are led to investigate the full-time church worker curriculum.

We are very much aware that students entering college do not necessarily have a clear vocation path and that others change their focus as education progresses. We also know people of all ages change career directions and overcome obstacles to pursuing the changes. That's why our LWML prayers continue for all our college students. God is lighting the walk; we don't need to know what age or circumstance is involved with those praying about church work vocations. "Listen, Listen, God is Calling." (LSB#833)

NEW MATERIALS

At each LWML convention, new materials are provided to aid members and societies in their personal and corporate walk with the Lord. This year Cheryl Petersen contributed several items: two devotions in "Living as a Woman in Mission" *Mustard Seeds* and Devotion #11 in the *Event and Meeting Planner*. STRUCTURE



Give attention to your bylaws

Is there someone in your society that is in charge of your Bylaws? If not, ask if anyone would like to be, or appoint someone. For example, the Treasurer could also be the Structure Chairman!

This person should compare the society bylaws to the zone, district, and national bylaws to make sure that you are in accord. When you think it's time to update, proceed with the task. Then send them to the district committee for review and suggestions.

National recommends that societies send a copy of their approved bylaws to the zone structure chairman. This is because there are great ideas out there on how things are handled. Why not share them with your fellow societies in your zone? Also, we all know we sometimes over clean things and pitch them, this way there is another copy somewhere.

The 2008-2010 MN North District Structure committee recommends that the zone structure chairman share the zone bylaws with their fellow zone chairman in their region. Maybe at one of your rallies you can share some of these great ideas.

Bylaws regulate only the organization to which they apply and are generally concerned with the operation of the organization, setting out the form, manner or procedure in which a organization should be run.

Bylaws widely vary from organization to organization, but generally cover topic such as how directors are elected, how meetings are conducted, and what officers the organization will have and a description of their duties. A common mnemonic device for remembering the typical articles in bylaws is NOMOMECPA pronounced "No mommy, see Pa!" It stands for Name, Object, Members, Officers, Meetings, Executive board, Committees, Parliamentary authority, Amendment.

Bylaws generally are voted by the membership, such as two-thirds present to amend them.

From the mountain-top to service

My experience at the Portland LWML Convention was truly a mountain top experience.

Ruth Koch, the keynote speaker, took us on a hike up Mt. Cambia – the Mountain of Change. She encouraged "chicks" of all ages to consider the change in LWML's future.

"Women of the post-modern generation are not attracted to 'women's groups.' They prize relationships that happen organically. They don't want to get stuck in a system or become just another cog in an organizational wheel."

Ruth illustrated the importance of trying something new to welcome all women. "Just love them, and for heaven's sake don't ask them to join a women's group". She encouraged women to try new approaches, which fit into today's busy single woman's schedule. "If your group is frozen in perfection, you are still frozen".

We need to show the women outside of our group that we care about them. Take some time to talk to them and tell them you are thinking about them. Send a "thinking of you card" and pray for them individually. Let God give you direction.

Ruth Koch spoke about embracing young adult women with a new kind of LWML hug: Loving – Welcome – Made possible by Limitless love of God. The Bible study leader, Dr. Mary Hilgendorf, led us through the study of Naomi. She encouraged us to take a young woman to coffee. Consider being a mentor.

Portland is a beautiful city – roses everywhere. Bob and I stayed with some old friends while we were there. They have a beautiful yard, full of flowers. My friend saves any used glass jars and gives flowers to anyone she thinks needs a "lift."

Maybe you have a special talent – are you sharing it? (I know there are wonderful bakers out there.) You received that talent from God now use it to share God's love.

I also want to stress the importance of being positive. So, maybe your society is small and getting smaller. Maybe you are all older women. God has a plan for each one of you. You are exactly where God wants you to be right now. Pray for Him to use you to serve Him and help spread the gospel through Christian love. You can always encourage younger women to be in the Word.

President, Jan Wendorf, has challenged all of us to be

in the Word, of the Word, and walking with the Lord.

We see changes coming in the LWML – good changes. God has a plan and His plan is always perfect.
