



Assembly of Leaders



The following information is taken from an outline provided by the Assembly of Leaders event in St. Louis, MO (2008) with the heading "A Time To Lead". The bold print copy is taken directly from the outline, with my interpretation and thoughts in regular print.

Learn about the organization you serve, its mission and its resources. Ask questions! Too often it is taken for granted that each society member knows how LWML is structured and its mission. We each need to help establish individual society goals, and the path to go in order to reach those goals, under the umbrella of the LWML guidelines and direction. These guidelines can be found on the MN North District website and the LWML website. There are many free resources also available on these two web sites. Your Zone President, your Regional Vice President, and your District Board Members are all willing to help you find whatever information needed.

Talk to previous and current **LWML members.** There are many long time LWML women within our societies who would love to share their history in LWML and the changes they have seen, the challenges they have faced, the projects they have undertaken, the joy of "doing" for our Lord. Let's also remember those new in the societies who have a lot to share in their thoughts on how the LWML can continue to grow in an ever changing society. What has "always" been done may not be the best thing to "always" do in the present and future. Not only share your thoughts but "really listen" as others share their thoughts. Have you gained a relationship with your fellow sisters within your society? Could you name each of them and share a little about their daily lives? Do you pray for them?

What are spiritual gifts according to the Bible? I attended the Spring LWML Rally in Bagley with Pastor Linden Wendzel leading the Bible Study talking about this very topic. Following are some of his thoughts put into my own words. In Ephesians 4:15 Paul points out what we are and what we have and that we should live a life worthy of our calling. We are each given gifts, different as He chooses. We have been called to walk in His light. We need to be humble, admit we may be wrong about a certain issue, and in turn not gloat if we happen to be right. We need to learn to defend an opinion without personal attack, practice patience. We are all led by ONE SPIRIT, ONE HOPE, ONE FAITH, ONE BAPTISM,

therefore we should work towards unity. God has given each one of us gifts as found in Romans 12: 6-14, 1 Corinthians 12:8-11, and 1 Peter 4:10-11. Every person has received gifts from God as found in 1 Corinthians 12:7. We need to strive towards unity within our societies and within our congregations.

What are your spiritual gifts? Have you taken the time to realize what gift/gifts our Lord has blessed you with? Take a few minutes to actually write them down. Now the question is: "How are you using your gifts?"

Recognize the spiritual gifts in others. God has blessed each of us with individual gifts, each different from the other. When we strive towards unity in Christ, each person's individual gifts are recognized. Putting these many different gifts together forms a mighty army, a united front, we will accomplish great things under theleadership of our Lord!


Mission Grants in Review

Grant #7 - Lutheran Braile Workers - \$5,000 (PAID IN FULL)

The Lutheran Library for the Blind is the largest Christian lending library in the world. The library has been serving patrons since 1939. In July 2012 Lutheran Blind Mission and Lutheran Braille Workers merged and the library was moved to Jacksonville, Fl. The library serves people who are blind or visually impaired, providing them with Christian materials in Braille, large print and audio. For many, this is their only connection with God. This grant provides monies for rent and utilities and will allow Lutheran Braille Workers to have additional resources to help with other items needed for the Library such as catalogs, new titles and the repair of damaged books.







Mission Grants Committee Report

A total of \$15,500 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$6,400 for Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students; \$4,100 for Orphan Grain Train (Paid in Full); \$5,000 for Lutheran Braille Workers. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2014-2016 biennium.



This article is the journey of several generations of women and the continuation of their family's service to our Lord.

Margaret (Luehmann) Schumann

Margaret was born and raised on a farm near Fair Haven, MN. She was baptized at Concordia Lutheran Church in Fair Haven MN. She lived with her grandparents in St Cloud to attend confirmation classes and school. She was confirmed at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in St Cloud. Margaret finished her high school years at Kimball. As a young mother of two, she and her family lived in Fair Haven and attended Concordia. It was there that she first attended a "Ladies Aid" meeting with her mother Elizabeth Luehmann. After several moves and working full time, she did not join LWML until she retired. By this time, she had been a member of Holy Cross Church in St Cloud for many years. She loved attending the meetings and soon took on the task of sending out greeting cards to the sick. She also was involved in the prayer chain. Margaret attended all the zone rallies and workshops. She was fortunate to attend a district convention with her daughter in Duluth. She never held an office but she loved being a part of LWML and her beloved church.

Yvonne (Schumann) Bardson

Yvonne's earliest memories of the LWML were of her going with her grandmother and mother to the "Ladies Aid" meetings after school. At that time school kids would join their mother and grandmother for lunch. Many years later, after her children were older, Yvonne joined the Evening Guild at Holy Cross in St Cloud. Soon she was elected to an office in her society. Her leadership roles continued; Yvonne also

held zone and district offices. In the 1980's, she filled a vacancy as Regional Vice President of Arrowhead II Region. She was elected to serve another term. Her first national convention was a "mountain top" experience. She has since attended many district and national conventions. Yvonne is still active in her local society at Immanuel Lutheran, Albany, and attends and supports her zone wherever she is needed.


