## **Our Accomplishments**

Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, (Philippians 2:4-5a).

As I read through the Human Care Reports, I realized how industrious the LWML women are in our district and how true the verses in Philippians are for LWML.

Listed below are some of the amazing accomplishments:

- Collected \$5,938.07 in a Bottles for Life Choice
  Project
- Assembled worship packages for local nursing home, alcohol treatment center and women's refuge include a copy of worship service for each Sunday.
- Distributed Personal Care Kits with Portals of Prayer and Mustard Seed Devotionals to Homeless and to Veterans Administration.
- Assisted in supporting Missionary Families.
- Donated time and products for Food Shelf sites
- Collected 280 Spanish Language Arch Books for the Central American Lutheran Mission Society.
- Made and gave over 1,800 quilts to crisis centers, disaster victims, parents of newborns, high school graduates, Orphan Grain Train, pediatric units at hospitals, homeless shelters, veterans' homes and more.
- Used Thrivent grant money as "Seed Money" to buy supplies for kits, and one zone provided supplies to four women's shelters with a \$4,000 Thrivent grant!
- Set up "Giving Trees" for people to help with supplies needed by various charitable organizations.

While the list is just a sampling of some of the accomplishments, I hope it shows how much our LWML District cares for others.

#### Inviting Women to Become Involved by Kathy Brandt

**LWML Vision Statement**: The LWML is the leading group for LCMS women where each woman is welcomed and encouraged to use her unique Godgiven gifts as she supports global missions and serves the Lord with gladness.

Women in congregations may not be familiar with LWML. They may not feel comfortable in attending a group event but yet they would like to be a part of the LWML mission to serve the Lord with gladness.

#### Some things YOU can do:

- Welcome her by introducing yourself and inviting her for a cup of coffee. Ask her to attend your Bible studies for spiritual inspiration. Introduce her to other group members to make her feel a part of the LWML family.
- Put together a packet of LWML resources to share. The packet may contain such things as the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly magazine, information about your group, LWML brochures and a Mite Box with information explaining mites and how they fund district and national mission grants.
- Some women may find it difficult to attend regular group events. Encourage her to volunteer in LWML activities, a mission project or a community outreach project. Engaging her in activities will give her opportunities for serving, fellowship and mentoring.
- Continue to share information with her and keep her current with LWML events that are happening. Encourage her to ask questions and to check the LWML website at lwml.org for current information and inspiration.
- Encourage and invite her to attend zone and district events, along with the district and national LWML conventions to see the larger body at work and be spiritually filled!

• The "bottom line" is to care personally about each woman as Jesus cares for her.

It is exciting to see how each quarter, as the Board of Directors of the LWML MN North District meets to allow payment, that more grants are funded. It is by God's grace and your generous giving that we can celebrate the progress for this 2018-2020 biennium.

## **Mission Grants Committee Report**

A total amount of \$20,000 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the



payment of grant allocations as follows: \$4,200 for Orphan Grain Train; \$10,000 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Student; \$3,800 for Project 24 Child Care, Christ's Care for Children Kenya; \$2,000 for "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2018-2020 biennium.
